Dear Rev. Frederick Kopp & Congregation:

On behalf of the Sierra Leonean community in Buffalo and the school pupils at the Evangelical Model Primary School at Roknola village, I am pleased to acknowledge receipt of your donation of three thousand five hundred dollars (\$3,500) toward the school building project at Roknola village in Sierra Leone. Thank you all for this big contribution to our country and the lives of our future leaders.

We are planning to work on the next phase of the project this April. This phase is intended to complete the floors and walls. If the funds permit, we may have a few windows installed. Please look forward to our update by the end of May or June 2024.

Outside the scope of our school building project, I am saddened to inform you that the aftermath of the social disturbances during the 2023 presidential elections in Sierra Leone is still lingering around. The country is currently facing serious political challenges: an alleged coup d'etat took place in November of 2023. As a result, the country's young and fragile democratic process is gradually falling apart. Without doubt this recent political upheaval has added to the high cost of living, and consequently high rate of students' dropouts from schools, lack of basic medical services, insufficient staple foods, unpurified drinking water etc. As our people continue to experience these unpleasant living conditions, I would like to ask for your prayers. Please remember Sierra Leone and the citizens in your daily prayers.

Again, I thank you, Pastor Frederick, your congregation, for all the goodness you have shared with the children of Sierra Leone. I pray that the Almighty God will continue to keep you all in good health and grant you prosperity in the years ahead.

We are very thankful to receive our generous grant of \$9,000 for our RIDE program from Lutheran Charities of Western New York. That money primarily goes to offer the immigrants and refugees in our Learner Permit classes the cost of a learner permit --- about \$70 per participant. These monies also allow us to offer ten professional driving lessons to our participants --- these 10 lessons include the required five-hour course and the road test --- at this time costing \$615 per participant. We are also very thankful for the monetary gifts we have received from the estates of two of our former members, and from other donors, including Trinity Old Lutheran and Coffee Hours.

Interest and participation in our program continue to be high. We receive requests for both permit classes and driving lessons mostly weekly. With funding from the time of the pandemic and last year's grant (\$9,000) we were able to help about 25 participants with permit and/or driving program... --- AMAZING!

Again, special thanks to Donna Bartkowski, Beth Kerr, Nora Pomplun, Carol Kreger, Paula Kerr, and Pastor for all of their help this past year.

We are hoping to offer learner permit classes this spring. We, already, have a nice beginning list of possible participants!


