

Augustana's Welcoming Statement

"You shall love your neighbor as yourself." Luke 10:27


LGBTQIA+ community are our children, parents, siblings and

The Three-Church Task Force recently met to continue building unity and shared purpose among our congregations in this part of Western New York. Guided by


