Pastor's Ponderings

Our Revelation study has been opening my eyes to the hope we can find in Jesus. In this study we are reminded that the Biblical message is that God comes to earth to live on it with us through Jesus, despite the occurrences of earthquakes, darkness, and plagues. In every age, God comes! God loves us and the world God made. God saw that it was good. This understanding comes in conflict with the theology of the Rapture that was developed within the last 200 years, in which accepting Jesus provides escape of an escalating end of the world mentality. I believe that this understanding is dangerous, because it takes the human race away from being accountable for their actions and away from the stewardship of the earth that God intended humans to have.

Being God's children is an act of God and not one in which we can decide who is in and who is out. Therefore our call is to treat all people like brothers and sisters in Christ. Our call is also to allow God's healing presence to be our motivation to care for God's earth.

I believe God's coming will be a kingdom on earth in which "all nations you have made will come and worship before you, O Lord and they will bring glory to your name" (Psalm 86:9). John writes in Revelation, "Behold I make all things new." I have hope for our world and the desire that we work towards a community that has at its core caring for, not judging, God's creations.



RECONCILING IN CHRIST COFFEE HOUR PRESENTATION SUNDAY, OCTOBER 22



One of the dreams or visions for our congregation and its programs, ministry, mission... is "wild" hospitality. This is, at least, in part, what TOL and Augustana are exploring as we consider the spectrum of sexual orientation, gender identity, and gender expression.

At the beginning of coffee hour on Sunday, October 22nd, our group invites you to watch a short video which shares a bit of what we've been doing.

As I read a Monday, September 18th devotion from *Christ in Our Home*, I was, again, reminded of this hospitality. The title of the devotion is "The blessing of unity" written by Karen Minnich-Sadler, a retired ELCA pastor, living in Lancaster County, PA. (*Christ in Our Home* can be found in the narthex on the bulletin table or the other table). How very good and pleasant it is when kindred live together in unity! (Psalm 133: 1) "One of the greatest blessings of being part of a faith community is the relationships we establish over the years. We worship together, laugh together, grieve together, and support one another through the challenges of life. Through all the ups and downs and differences, we show the world how people of differing views and personalities [and orientations]... can live and function as a community that has a warm and welcoming heart."

We are at our best when we strive to love one another unconditionally, share each other's stories, go the distance with one another and help each other stand when we feel we cannot do so alone. Together, we have learned we need one another, and because of the bond of the faith community, we are never alone. We're blessed by the presence of both Christ in our midst and the Christ we can see in each other. It is this Christ-presence that teaches us how to live together in grace.

Your love, O God, unites us all. Help us embrace this truth as we live with our differences. Amen.
