# Pastor's Ponderings

"Do not lie to one another, seeing that you have stripped off the old self with its practices and have clothed yourselves with the new self, which is being renewed in knowledge according to the image of its creator. In that renewal there is no longer Greek and Jew, circumcised and uncircumcised, barbarian, Scythian, slave and free; but Christ is all and in all!"

I write this, days after the terrible shooting in Buffalo. I, with all western New York and the country, have come face to face with ideologies that are evil and that do not have a place in our society. White supremacy and conspiracy theories promote fear and division and are wrong. As we can see from Paul's letter to the Colossians, becoming new in Christ we are no longer divided but unified. This unity that is hoped for in Jesus Christ our Lord and Savior can not be done without recognizing that structures, laws, and actions that we take and have in the United States, directly result in the perpetuation of racism and division.

The church can be a place where we can work hard to be a safe place where the difficult subject of Racism can be addressed. In an article from Baylor University's Center for Christian Ethics, it states that the church can provide stability. The ability to stay with a group for a long time. This is needed because to be reconciled to one another we need to practice confession and forgiveness in sometimes a painful way. It takes time and commitment to foster healing and change.

The church can also practice "true Christian hospitality." This is hard work which means, not merely tolerating or being nice to others, but to truly welcome them into all aspects of the community. This hospitality builds community and trust.

The church can also practice foot washing. This forces us to admit that we are not self sufficient and that we must serve others and accept others' services. When we practice this across racial lines it is a powerful reminder of our unity in Christ.

I am attempting to listen and act so that change can happen for the better. And will pray that racism can be addressed and lessened.



# Gardening News



The gardening team of Paul,
Donna and Tom have started
making progress in the gardens
this season. Paul keeps all of
the shrubs near the front door
and parking lot looking good, as
well as the island bed.

The sunny native plant garden on the Rockland Rd. side is doing well with more than 40 milkweed plants, ready to be hosts for Monarch butterfly eggs. Be sure to stop by after church and check on the milkweed and (hopefully) Monarch caterpillars as the season progresses.

Donna is happy that all but two of the plants in the 'Erie County Native Plant' shade garden came back this year and are thriving. This is the garden next to the wheelchair elevator door, also called the 'drainpipe garden.' Three of the plants are Jacob's Ladder, and three are Christmas ferns, both chosen because their common names have a connection with the Bible.







And things are looking good in the hosta garden, too.
